limit of possibilities. There may be another source of energy still more potent than the disruption of atoms. This other source resides in that elusive something that conveys the light of the sun through so-called empty space to the earth. Is that space really empty? If so, how can it carry the light across the gap? For light moves like a wave, and where there is a wave there must be something of which the wave is made, so it would seem according to the usual way of thinking. This mysterious something has been termed the ether, the luminiferous or light-carrying ether. Its very existence is somewhat doubtful, yet in some respects the empty space between stars behave as if it contained something very substantial, some thing which is a thousand million times denser than water and of which the individual parts are continually acquiring with a speed of 185,000 miles a second! A piece of the ether of the size of a pin's head, according to this theory of the late Lord Kelvin, would contain enough energy to furnish one million horse power for forty million years!

FR. O'DONNELL WAS ACQUITTED
LONDON, Nov. 28.—Father O'Donnell, the Australian chaplain, arrested August 18 charged with using traitorous and disloyal language, was acquitted today by the court martial trying him.
In the course of his testimony today Father O'Donnell denied all charges that he had used seditious language. He declared he was a Nationalist and never mentioned the King's name except in eulogizing him for his en-deavors to end the recent railway strike. Father O'Donnell testified that he had not referred to the spread of the Sinn Fein movement to Australia.
