The very best of the different kinds of farm machinery made in Canada. The board also built a stand to seat two hundred people facing the horse ring, for the accommodation of those witnessing the judging. This was well filled, thus showing the peoples' appreciation of it.
Your Directors had the grand stand thoroughly examined, and at considerable cost repaired. This was thought necessary for its safe use. It is now as strong as when it was first built.

We notice with pleasure that our Island exhibitors were successful in carrying off a large amount of prize money at the recent Winter Fair at Amherst, and again this year the silver cup, given as the grand championship for the best pen of three swine has been captured by an Island exhibitor.

We have to report a still further increase in the number and quality of the exhibits from the adjoining counties.

Our exhibition dates for 1911 will be the same week in September as last year.

There were three days good horse racing during exhibition week, and your Directors were again pleased to see the marked improvement in Island horses.

Your Directors are glad to report, that although the Tuesday of exhibition week was very wet, and they were unable to have the races on that day, yet the remaining three days were fine, and there is as will be seen by their financial statement, after paying a dividend of three per cent., a considerable balance to credit.

A portion of this surplus is however required for keeping the exhibition grounds and fences in an efficient state of repair. The main fence to be entirely renewed. The race track also requires on it the expenditure of a considerable sum of money, which though ordered last year, your Directors have not yet expended. It will also be required to erect suitable electric light fixtures on the grounds, serviceable for continuous use. The present cost of electric lighting being wholly disproportionate to the services rendered.

There will also be required an expenditure on the racing stable to make them more suitable for the purpose, and apparently the roof of the grand stand requires to be reshingled.

This expenditure your Directors recommend as necessary, it being in their opinion the first duty of the Association to have the exhibition grounds and buildings in first class order and repair, any balance remaining will be placed to rest account.

Mr. Ings, retiring from the Board after the last annual meeting, the Board appointed in his place instead Mr. James Paton.

Your Board desire to express their appreciation of Mr. Ings' valuable services during the directorship.

Your Board granted a bonus to the secretary of \$250.00, his services being much more enormous and more clerical assistance being required by reason of it being a Dominion Exhibition. Your Board also granted a bonus to the keeper, Mr. Gillis, of \$30.00 for extra duties performed and in recognition of his faithful services. The Secretary's report is submitted herewith.

THE YOUNG MEN'S MAN

WEIRD DISCOVERY IN LOUISBURG

LOUISBURG, Jan. 9.—A weird discovery was made at Louisburg a few days ago, the story of which the Record has obtained corroboration for.

There was occasion recently to open the grave of a man who had been dead five years. Those who saw the remains were astounded to find that the body was in a perfect state of preservation and that a long beard had grown upon the dead man, who had always kept his face smooth and shaven. The manner of his death may have had something to do with the phenomenon.

The man mentioned was electrocuted five years ago while working as an electric line man near Glace Bay. He belonged to Louisburg, and his remains were taken there and interred. He was a man of less than thirty years at the time he was killed.

A few weeks ago a brother of the man mentioned also met a sudden death. He was killed aboard a coal train on which he was working. His remains were also taken home for burial. It became necessary to make more room in the burial lot of the family, and the remains of the brother first killed were taken up to make the rearrangement.

His relatives were startled to find that there was no detectable difference in the appearance of the body from that which it had at the time of interment. Still more startling was that the beard had grown until it was like that of an old man, brushing against the face glass of the coffin.
