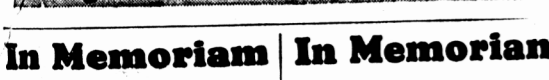

Fur Shipments To Free Port Zones Discussed In Commons

The following is from Hansard report of the House of Commons proceedings, Aug. 30, the House being in committee of the whole on the subject of free port zones.

Mr. McClure (Queens): "I should like to get some information on a question that has been raised in the departments. Probably I can get it in this department. In the exporting of goods to the United States, there are what are called port zones, the customs department in Charlottetown last year did some work in this connection. I am proceeding to a considerable quantity of goods. He was buying and exporting goods to the port zone in New York, and the customs officer at Charlottetown, properly so, took the matter up on this man's behalf with Ottawa, but it took a whole day before the exporter could get his papers through."

"What I am coming at is this. The department should provide these customs officers with the necessary information for shipments of that kind. I realize that such shipments are not a very frequent thing, but I am glad to say this on his behalf, because he did excellent work on 'his' telephone and telegraph, he got in touch with New York and Ottawa, and as I say, he took a day for the man to get his papers completed."

Mr. McCann: "What sort of commodity was he dealing in?"

Mr. McClure: "Furs. They were dutiable and were going into the free zone."

Mr. McCann: "The free zone would not make so much difference."

Fur Shipments To Free Port Zones Discussed In Commons

Our department acts as agent for trade and commerce, and if the shipper had the proper export permit there would be no delay on our part. I am glad to hear that the customs department in Charlottetown, and I may say that similar comments come from one of the officers of the service of all the officers."

Mr. McClure: "The express company should know that the article is dutiable and that the ordinary export entry is not sufficient. If they knew this they would not carry the article. I suggest that instructions be given the officer they know when he issues the export permits so as to have it acceptable to the express company if whatever transport company they may use."

Mr. McCann: "We will canvass the situation and see if it can be clarified."

Item agreed to.
