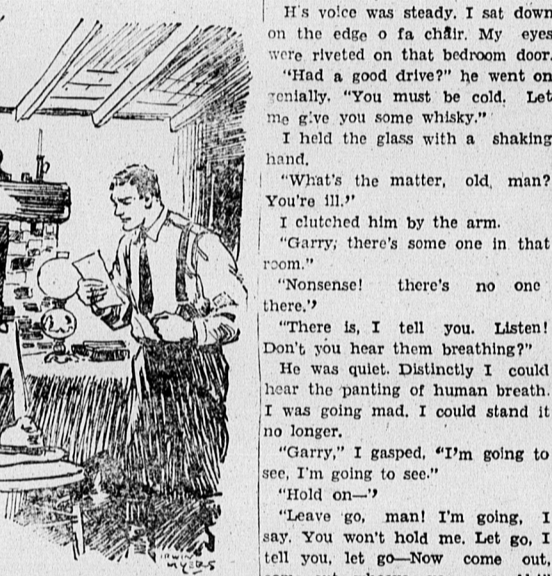
"If you are fool enough to believe that Berna is faithful to you visit your brother's room tonight."

Two Big Cannons Are Unearthed

HALIFAX, N. S., Dec. 7—Halifax has no use for its armament of 60 years ago—too old to be of use and not old enough to be antique. And so two ponderous cannon, vintage of 1889, dug up behind the Nova Scotia Technical College, have been committed to the earth again.

One was a nine inch, muzzle loading rifled gun, made in the Royal Gun Factory at Woolwich, England. The other was of the same type, but two inches less in the bore. This class of cannon was used in all the coast defenses at the time these two were manufactured, said Harry Piers, curator of the provincial museum, who added that although the guns were not sufficiently antiquated to be of great historical interest as yet, their value would increase with the years.

The authorities, however, decided that the old pieces were just plain, second hand junk, and dug them under for some future excavator to find.
