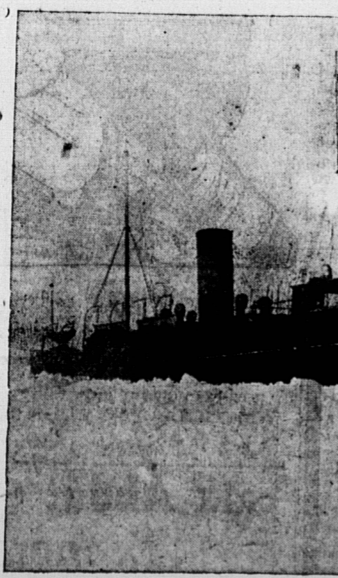
JAPANESE PAPER SIGNS NEW NOTE

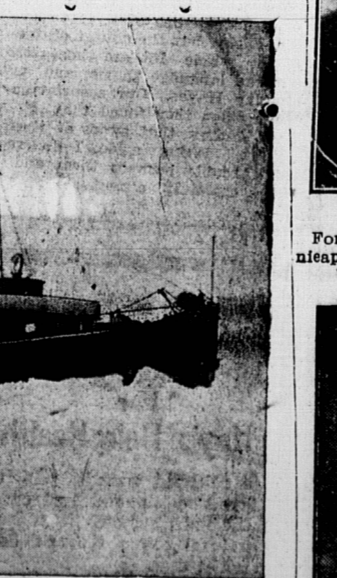

(Continued from page 1.) four Opposition members in 1879 and two of these were on the committee. As to questions asked in the House last year, many of them were asked because of the inaction of this committee.

HON. MR. CUMMISKEY said there were ten members of the Opposition in 1879, and quoted their names. MR. COX defended the personnel of the committee and charged the Opposition with obstruction. He would like to see Mr. McLean on the committee himself, but felt quite competent.

MR. MORSON read from the journals of 1879 to show there were but four members of the Opposition. It was found that there was a change of Government in that year. There were ten members of Opposition before the change and only four afterward in the same year.

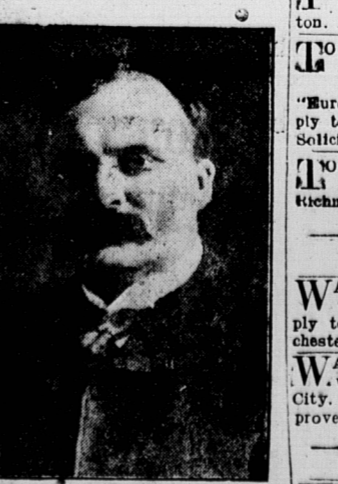
HON. MR. CUMMISKEY said in 1888 and 1889 there were but two opposition members on the committee. MR. PALMER said it was clear the Government were following the practice of both parties in the past. He would do his duty as chairman fairly. If any unfairness was complained of, later he would be glad to see a third man put on to represent the Opposition, in place of one to retire from the majority.
