SUNDAY SERMONETTE

Text: Brethren, pray for us." 1 Thessalonians, 5:25
On the third Sunday in Advent our Church reminds us of the Holy Ministry, as a means of preparation for Christ's second coming in judgment. And as I think of that awful responsibility I say more and more earnestly "Brethren pray for us." In at least seven of his epistles St. Paul makes this appeal to his churches and it is touching, very touching to observe how he introduces this demand upon their sympathies and prayers. He first prays for them with pure and fatherly application: "May the very God of peace sanctify you whole and I pray God your whole spirit and soul and body be preserved blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ." It is then that he asks for himself: "Brethren pray

for us." It is true indeed and remarkable that Christ never asked for Himself or as far as we know never had the prayers of His disciples. But then He had the spirit immeasurably and was above impressioned. I knew no stronger proof of the Deity of Jesus than this,—that He did not require or admit intercession. I have sent out many messages endeavoring to bring the comfort and the cheer of God to your hearts. This time I ask something of you. No matter how restricted you are, every one of you can pray and that is a great thing. The backbone of the whole structure of the work which is done for God in the world, is the prayer which lies behind it and when the results and the gains are gathered up, the praying ones will more than divide half the spoils. When Esther went on her solitary missions for the Jews to Ahasuerus she was careful first to secure for herself the fasting and prayers of all the Jews in Shushan—while she was before the king. Which had the victory? Did the queen or the supplicants gain the suit? Was it the angel or the prayer, that was made without ceasing unto God for him which really unlocked Peter's prison doors? So indeed when you pray in your homes for us, you are more than partners in all the preaching, teaching, comforting and edifying. Let me affectionately beg of you that you will pray for us, as teachers that we ourselves may be taught of the Holy Ghost and have more of the mind of Jesus; and that eschewing all false doctrine, we may hold and teach and feel, the truth—the simple truth in all its proportions. Pray for us as preachers—that we may never preach ourselves but Christ and Him only—in all His fulness without stint and without limit;—affectionately, earnestly, persuasively, lovingly, savingly; give true bread to our people—speaking as a dying man to dying men. Pray for us as ministers of holy sacraments and of the word and of the services of the church—that her beauty and grace may never be injured by us and

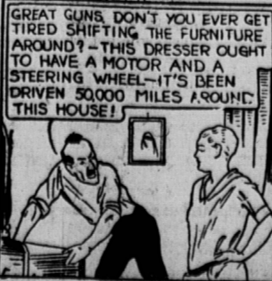
