SEED CLEANING PLANT OPENED AT SOURIS.—The Prince Edward Island Seed Growers Association have just opened a new seed cleaning plant at Souris. The building 24x40 three story high has just been completed and reflects much credit on the contractors "Mallard Bros." Gown Brae. The plant is equipped with two clipper cleaners manufactured by A. T. Ferrell and Co., Saginaw, Michigan, and are capable of cleaning oats, wheat, barley, timothy seed, clover and all kinds of bent grasses with a capacity of 10 bushels per hour for grain. The power used to drive the machines is a Lister full Diesel Engine the only one of its kind in the province. It has a cold start without magneto or battery and a fuel consumption at a cost of 4c per hour and manufactured by R. A. Lister and Co. Dursley, Gloucestershire, England. The seed is cleaned and marked in a co-operative way. This gives the farmers of Kings County an opportunity to market their surplus seed. There is no question about the quality when our fields are inspected by government officials and tested in our Dominion Seed Laboratory at Sackville: This is done under our federal department of Agriculture and fostered by our Dominion Seed Branch at Ottawa. Prince Edward Island is fast growing a reputation for seed of all kinds and on account of the cool climate there is no chance for germination during the harvesting season.

10th Maritime Tuxis Boys Parliament (Canadian Press) SACKVILLE, N. B., Dec. 27.—When the tenth Maritime Tuxis Boys' Parliament convened here tonight in Mount Allison University residence, Ralph Connors, of Westville, N. S., was elected Premier succeeding Angus Cameron, of Sackville. Thirty delegates were present. The first formal sitting of Parliament will be held tomorrow afternoon. J.
