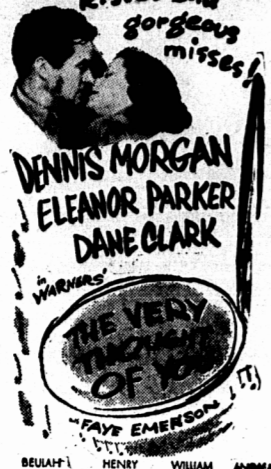

Will Visit All Auxiliaries Of Bible Society

Rev. A. H. Wilkinson, M.A., B.D., one of the general secretaries of the British and Foreign Bible Society, London, England, plans to visit all the auxiliaries of the Society in Canada and Newfoundland.

He will be accompanied by his wife, who has had missionary experiences in China and is thoroughly conversant with the work of the British and Foreign Bible Society.

He is a member of the Church of England in 1912. When the first great war broke out he volunteered for service in the ranks but was rejected because he was a clergyman.

He went to China on the staff of the Church Missionary Society, and after serving four years during part of which he worked about selling copies of the Scriptures like a colporteur.

He was appointed one of the secretaries of the British and Foreign Bible Society in 1929 and has held that post since.

He has just recovered from a rather serious illness, aggravated by the loss of his son Paul, of the R.A.F., who after winning the D.F.C. crashed over one of the Scottish islands.

Mr. Wilkinson has a most attractive personality, is a fine speaker, and is looking forward with great anticipation to his time in Canada and Newfoundland.

The Rev. Mr. Wilkinson will visit the E. I. Auxiliary coming on the evening of November 17th, remaining till the morning of the 19th.

He will deliver several addresses. Mr. Wilkinson will be accompanied by his wife, also Rev. J. B. McArthur, D.D., general secretary of the Society in Canada and Newfoundland, and also by the District Secretary of the Society, Rev. J. M. Murchison.
