THE COMING GIANT STEAMSHIPS.

Vessels of the Great-Northern Company Will be the Largest in the World.

The ocean vessels which are now being required in the construction will aggregate fully 25,000 tons, including about 4,500,000 rivets and 40 miles of wire.

The ships are constructed with a double bottom, consisting of a surface of plate similar to the outside shell extending the whole length vessel. The space is divided into water-tight compartments to preserve the ship from sinking or the cargo from being damaged.

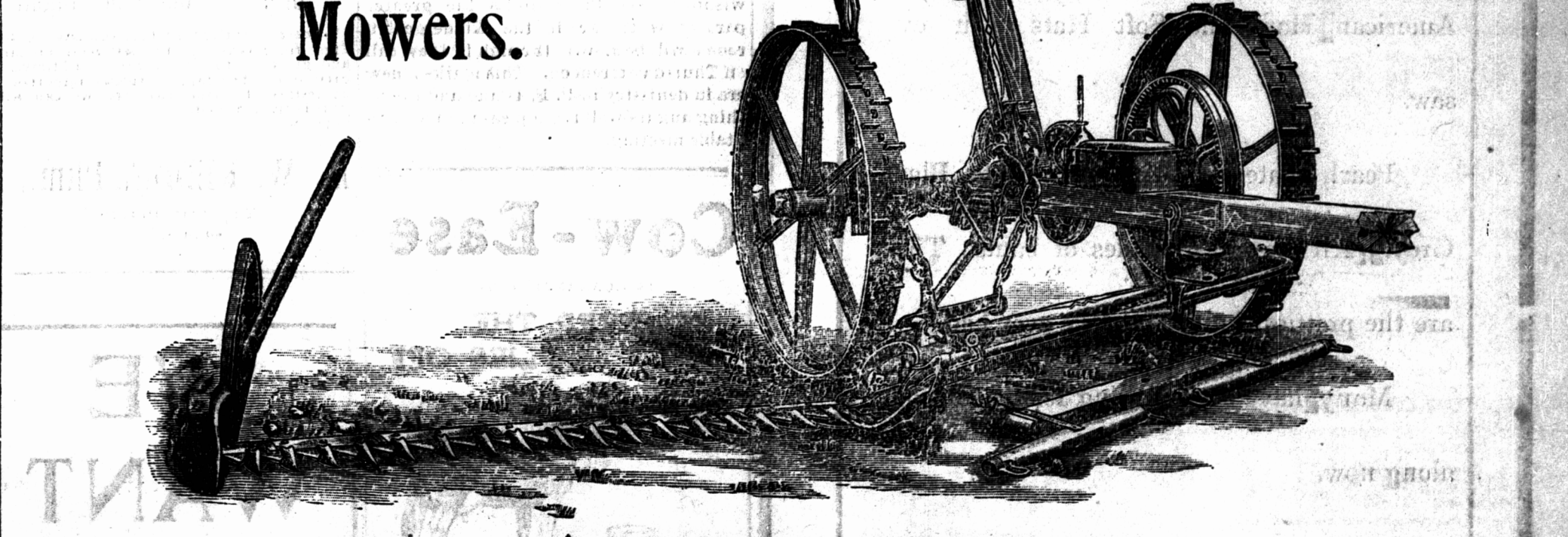
