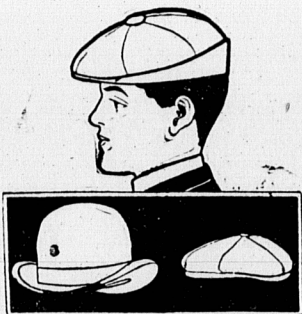

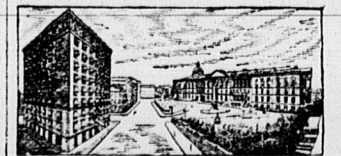

PRESIDENT PLUMMER WILL NOT TALK

MONTREAL, Que., Feb. 18—J. H. Plummer, President of the Steel Company, was here yesterday, and admits that the Coal Company has made them two offers. He declined to give the terms, as they have not been considered as yet, and will not be till the full text of the judgment arrives. This is expected to reach Halifax on Friday and be here Saturday. As to the rumor that the Coal people have quietly secured control of Steel-Stock, there is no confirmation or denial. The Ross crowd refuse to say a word, and the Steel people do not know. There is a general feeling on the street that there is something in it, though to what extent there is no means of knowing. The two propositions from the Coal Company are said to be:

- (1). To carry out the original contract.
- (2). To make a new contract.

PROGRESS IN CANADIAN SHIPBUILDING.

OTTAWA, Feb. 19—The annual report of the Marine Department shows the total number of new vessels built and registered in the Dominion during the year to be 392, measuring 38,310 tons registered, with a total estimated value of \$1,725,000. The total number of vessels of the Dominion was 7,528, measuring 698,688 tons. The number of steamers was 3,000 with a gross tonnage of 471,796 tons. Canada, in its total of registered tonnage, ranks tenth among the Maritime countries of the world.

PROVINCIAL BARK IN DISTRESS.

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld., Feb. 19—Unaware of the nearness of treacherous Cape Race, the P. E. Island bark Lavinia, from Pernambuco for St. John's, in ballast, ran ashore in the midst of a blinding snowstorm. The crew escaped. The bark lay in such a position after driving on shore that she was exposed to the full force of the heavy seas and will probably be a total wreck. Captain Wilson and the crew of the Lavinia were all shipped from Newfoundland. The bark was of 319 tons and was built at P. E. Island in 1878. She was owned by the Adelaide Steam Tug Co., of Adelaide.

READVILLE TRACK DOOMED.

BOSTON, Feb. 18—Another step toward obliterating the famous Readville track was taken yesterday at the meeting of the New England Trotting Horse Breeders' Association at which a committee was appointed to sell the property for seventy thousand dollars or less and report at another meeting in April. It is expected that A. J. Welch, of Hartford (Conn.), will be one of the bidders for the track, but there are no plans for continuing the racing.

NEW YORK, Feb. 19—The Mauretania has not only broken her own record over the long course, but brought down the figures held by the Lusitania and has set a new record of four days, seventeen hours and fifty minutes. Another achievement of the voyage was a day's run of six hundred and seventy one knots which breaks all records.

HILL'S INVASION OF THE WEST.

TORONTO, Feb. 19—Hill's invasion of the West will be further advanced by a bill introduced in the Manitoba Legislature for the incorporation of the Great Northern Railroad in Manitoba and asking for power to build a line from Winnipeg to Brandon and Elk Horn. Five years is given for commencement of the work and ten years for its completion.

FROZEN TO DEATH IN WOODS.

SUSSEX, N. B., Feb. 19—Ernest Rupert, whose home is near Hampton, was found in the woods near Newton frozen to death.

FRANCE TO EXPEND \$160,000,000 ON NAVY

PARIS, Feb. 18—M. Picard, the new neo-political French minister of marine, who was specially appointed to the control of the navy on the personal initiative of M. Clemenceau, has submitted to M. Caillaux, the minister of finance, a proposal to spend the sum of one hundred and sixty million dollars over and above the ordinary estimates on the French navy. The expenditure would be spread over a period of five years.
