SENATOR LODGE FACES DEFEAT

BOSTON, Jan. 16—United States Senator Henry Cabot Lodge was nominated at the Republican caucus today for a fourth term by 125 out of 153 Republican members of the legislature, or sixteen less than a majority of the house and senate on joint ballot. As the absentees were nearly all from the house, it is anticipated that the majority of the state's votes will be cast for Mr. Lodge tomorrow, but that the house will be deadlocked. Whether this deadlock will continue to the joint convention on Wednesday was a matter of interesting conjecture tonight. While it was generally admitted that should Mr. Lodge be returned he would have to seek some Democratic support, Sherman L. Whipple, of Brookline, a prominent member of the Suffolk bar, who has never held office but who has appeared quite frequently on the Democratic stump, was selected by the Democrats at their caucus as

Since leaving Canada he has been in South Africa, and for a time head of the work in Scandinavia. He is accompanied by Mrs. Rees, their daughter, Captain Ruth H. Rees, two sons and two younger daughters.

HOUSEKEEPING MADE EASY BY ONE WHO KNOWS.
