BIG TREASURE HUNT FOR SUBMERGED GOLD
Hulk of Vessel Wrecked in 1859, May Yield Vast Fortune—Many Coins Found by Seashore Dwellers in The Vicinity of The Wreck.

LONDON, Nov. 11.—Another search for lost treasure is about to begin under the auspices of a British company.

This time it is gold brought from Australia in 1859 that is the object of the search. It is believed to be in or near a wreck at Moelre, on the coast of Anglesey.

The wreck in question was one of the most terrible in seafaring annals. The Royal Charter, a full-rigged ship called from an Australian port with nearly 500 persons, crew and passengers, on board.

A large portion of the passengers were gold-diggers who had "made their pile" and were returning home as rich men. The gold they brought with them was contained partly in belts worn by the owners, but mainly in two great boxes.

The value of all the gold on the ship is estimated at more than \$7,500,000.

The Royal Charter struck on a reef at Moelre, and became a total wreck. Four hundred and fifty-nine of her crew and passengers were drowned.

There have been many efforts to recover the gold from the wreck, and it is understood that the smaller of the chests that contained the bulk of the treasure was found at an early period. Dwellers along the coast profited by digging in the sands, and even in recent years prospecting of this sort has been rewarded occasionally by the discovery of a few coins.

The wreck is still in existence, and partly visible. The bow of the vessel is hard on a rock, but the stern is embedded in sand. It is the plan now to destroy the wreck by dynamite and search by diving and dredging in the debris for the larger of the treasure chests.

Preparations for the work are in active progress at Holyhead, Councillor Edward Owen, who is an expert in such matters, will superintend the operations.

TEXAS RANGERS WERE AMBUSHED

HOUSTON, Tex., Nov. 9.—A special to the Chronicle from Laredo, Texas, says: Four Texas Rangers sent to Rio Grande City to quit turbulent political conditions there and investigate the assassination of District Judge Welch, which occurred the night before the election, were ambushed by a body of armed Mexicans between Fordyce and Rio Grande City late last night. The Rangers were asleep in camp when awakened by a volley of shots from the darkness. A fight ensued and four of the attacking party were killed, one fatally wounded and two captured. The Rangers escaped unscathed.

money to the value of the upset price of this land. In other words, if they, the federal authorities have given away fifty millions of acres to other Provinces and cannot do this for the eastern Provinces, then they must compensate us by distributing at least fifty millions of dollars to these outraged eastern Provinces or contribute to the present subsidy an amount equal to the yearly interest on this sum. This would be a low estimate on the value and quantity of the land and is certainly a fair proposition. In addition, the representation should be determined on a basis more in keeping with the population within the original boundaries.

There could be no honest refusal to this demand, but if denied then every foot of land added to any Province, in excess of its original holdings should be demanded released to revert to the Crown and erected in separate Provinces or territories. Surely this is just. It seems clear that the Dominion either owes us many millions of acres or many millions of dollars. The debt can be discharged in the most convenient form, but it must be paid. This should be the stand of the Maritime Provinces, and if this stand were unyieldingly taken it would have to be assented to. It seems to the ordinary mind, at least, that the Privy Council, by its judicial committee, must allow the claim if refused by the Dominion.

In conclusion, there seems to be a feeling of self congratulation in the Maritime Provinces because of the so-called success of the recent Conference of Provincial Premiers whereby substantial increases have been made to our provincial subsidies. But is this success as real as it seems? Let it be remembered that we shared on precisely the same basis as did the Provinces to whom the large grants of land have from time to time been given. Was there a disposition to be too easily satisfied with a sop? Premier McBride of British Columbia came to the conference with a special claim for his Province. This claim was disallowed by the conference and our representatives gave their voice against it. In view of the foregoing it does seem that some Provinces might justly be entitled to special consideration, and none more so than the Maritime Provinces. If the maritime representatives had stood with the Premiers of Manitoba and British Columbia this claim could hardly have failed of recognition. But now we are told that there must be no more coming back. Is our opportunity then bartered away forever? There is to be in the very near future another conference of provincial Premiers but only of those specially favoured ones who claim a right to the outlying federal territory. Their business will be to decide how Keewatin and Ungava will be parceled out among themselves. Could not our ever-going Premiers enter a protest against this spoliation unless equal compensation be given us?
