TIMELY NOTES ON TOPICS CONNECTED WITH Silver Fox Farming

The Canadian Fur Auction Sales Company, Ltd., of Montreal will hold their next auction of silver fox skins commencing on Monday morning, March 29th, at ten o'clock, and the sale will probably be completed Tuesday noon. If so the first section of the silver fox catalogue with an offering of 5,000 pelts will be on. Then on Wednesday, March 31st, there will be a special collection of silver fox and 9,000 silver fox the balance of the first section, and on Thursday 700 silver fox, special collection, and 6,910 silver fox second section.

The Canadian Fur Auction Company has sent a letter to buyers and shippers which in brief is as follows: "Starting Monday, March 29th, we will offer at auction throughout the Canadian period, a collection Canadian raw furs listed herewith. The general catalogue which will contain all articles with the exception of silver fox pelts, will be sold first, namely, throughout Monday and Tuesday morning, and should be completed by noon that day. The principal articles that comprise the general catalogue are—beaver, wild and ranch mink, wolf, red fox, cross fox and Alaska seal skins, together with smaller quantities of ermine, lynx, marten, fisher and other.

The most important article in our coming sale on a basis of quantity and value is our collection of approximately 24,000 silver fox pelts. These will start selling at 2.00 p.m. Tuesday afternoon, March 30th. Our regular collection comprising about 23,000 skins will be offered in two sections, which contain approximately the following—10 per cent selected full silvers, 40 per cent regular full silvers, 45 per cent inferior grades, all color phases. The remaining 15 per cent is made up of selected and regular one-half to three-quarters silver pelts, pearls, pearl platins and other new types and low grade pelts.

In addition there are two special collections totalling about 1,000 skins. These are platinum, silver platinum and white faces. The majority of these two groups are white faces. The silver fox collection in its entirety should appeal to all prospective buyers.

The March number of the Canadian Silver Fox and Fur is an exceptionally good one. On the cover is a photo of two very beautiful pelts belonging to W. H. C. Ruiven, Allison, Ontario. They took first and second prizes in the 1943 medium class at the 1943 Ontario pelts show. There are a Cady strain platinum dog and a Teakie white face that photographed well.

THE SMITHSONIAN INSTITUTE

The Smithsonian Institution includes, amongst other things, the National Museum of the U.S.A., the greatest collection of natural history objects in the continent, and it may be, in the whole world. A strange to say the Institution grew from the ideas, and was supported by the wealth, of an Englishman, about a century ago.

This was James Smithson, the illegitimate son of one of the Barons of Northampton. His mother was well-born, as it is termed, being a lineal descendant of Henry VII. James Smithson, according to the great American naturalist, Louis Agassiz, was fond of science and travel; a cultured and studious bachelor. But his feelings had been somewhat unsettled by the Royal Society of Britain failed to publish some papers he had written, and he thereupon directed that at his decease, his wealth (amounting to \$368,318) should go "to found at Washington, under the name of the Smithsonian Institution, an establishment for the increase and diffusion of knowledge among men." And so by Act of Congress in 1846, the Institution was created.

Today, from other endowments and wise investments the Institution has \$6,577,000 at command; and every year there are Federal appropriations to aid in research projects and in upkeep of buildings. The administrative headquarters of the organization are in an old red sandstone castle on a broad lawn off Constitution Avenue.

Adjust and Repair Farm Machinery

Winter is the logical time in which to adjust and repair agricultural machinery against the opening of the year. It is essential to the farm, and much reconditioning may be done with tools available on the spot. The technique required for repairing or adjusting one machine may be valuable in dealing with other varieties of equipment, so that the information given in the Farmer's Bulletin No. 116 on "Mower Repairs and Adjustment" is applicable to sections of other machines, such as the cutting mechanism of grain binders and corn shellers. However, mowers and other equipment may be repaired and adjusted in such a way that the machines will give general service and prevent avoidable delays where the machines are most needed. The bulletin may be obtained by writing to the Publicity and Extension Division, Dominion Department of Agriculture, Ottawa.

Heavier Hogs Not Wanted By Britain

The question of heavier hogs was discussed at the Dominion-Frontier Agricultural Conference held in Ottawa during the second week of last December. It was pointed out that the reason why the British are not interested in obtaining so much bacon from Canada is because the Dominion produces the kind of bacon the British people want.
