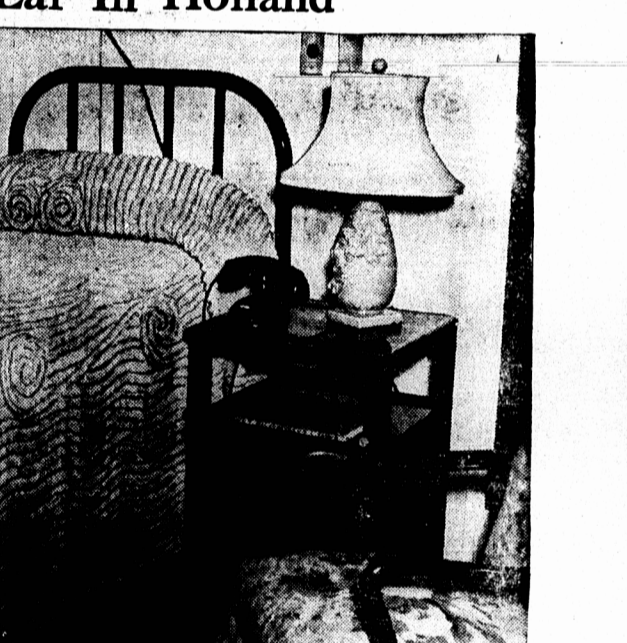
News Of This Birth In Canada's Capital Will Reach Every Ear In Holland
