At Quebec more passengers than the Ruthenia could take presented themselves. Some had to be left and will sail from St. John or Halifax.

SENT TO SUPREME COURT.—Constable Smith of Tignish, yesterday, brought to Summerside and lodged in jail to await trial at the next term of the Supreme Court, Thomas DesRoche, of Woodville, Lot 2, who has confessed to stealing the horse and buggy which so mysteriously disappeared from the tea grounds at Alberton on July 20th, last and which was found some weeks later in a swamp, the horse dead. In the confession, which was secured from the prisoner by the "Yankee detective," DeRoche states that while drunk he took the horse from the tea grounds and remembers leaving him by the side of the road about 9 o'clock that night, eight or nine miles distant. He claims to remember nothing more about the matter, and in the confession begs for mercy. When taken before Mr. Joseph Richards, J. P., he acknowledged having made the confession produced in court upon which he was sent up for trial in the Supreme Court.

CHARGED TO INFECTED MILK. A typhoid epidemic on the lower east side of New York, which at least accounts claimed 271 cases, was charged by the health department to milk obtained from certain dairies. In more than sixty per cent of the cases it is stated, the families were found to have been supplied with the same quality of milk. Health Commissioner Lederle issued a warning in which he said the only way possible time on the pasteurization of all milk sold in this city, if the observation as to the cause of the outbreak were confirmed. The outbreak, he added, served as one more emphatic warning to the public of the risk that accompanied the drinking of any raw milk.

At Parsons, Kan., twenty cases of typhoid were traced by the state epidemiologist to water from a well in which a certain dairyman washed his milk bottles. The well was located between the barn and his house and within forty feet of an old-fashioned vault. About a dozen cases of typhoid developed at St. Paul, Minn., mostly among customers of a certain dairy. A number of people availed themselves of the offer of the health department to vaccinate with anti-typhoid serum.
