FINANCE

NEW YORK, May 9-(AP)—Buyers took on scattered coppers, rails and industrials in today's stock market but left many leaders to shift for themselves in a narrow range.
Canadian issues were mixed. Bell Telephone led the losers down a full point and Distillers Seagram lost 1-2 and Lake Shore 1-4. Walkers was the big gainer up 5-8 and Ford and Imperial Oil each advanced 1-8.
The Associated Press average of 80 stocks was unchanged at 39.8. Dealings slowed after moderate activity in the forenoon. Transfers amounted to 397,380 shares compared with 440,400 Thursday.
An exception to slim movements elsewhere was a last-minute burst of strength in Southern Railway. Mobile and Ohio trust certificates which jumped 4 7-8 points to a new year's top at 32 7-8.
General Motors was up 1-8 and Chrysler down 3-8, although automotive production pushed up sharply this week under the impetus of near-record sales demand.
Santa Fe, N.Y. Central, Great Northern and Chesapeake and Ohio were up a shade as traffic prospects brightened for most roads.
Ohio Oil was up 3-8 at 9, a new 1941 high, but Standard of N.J. and Texas Corp. were behind. Modest improvement was shown for U.S. Steel, Bethlehem, J.C. Penney, Du Pont, United Aircraft and International Paper common and pd.

WINNIPEG, May 9-(CP)—Additional sales of Canadian wheat overseas and good gains at Chicago lifted May wheat 1-8 cent over its peg of 75 1/8 cents a bushel on Winnipeg grain exchange today. The minimum advance was held, and values closed 1-8 higher to unchanged.
CHICAGO, May 9-(AP)—Wheat and other grains and provisions resumed the price advance today as longed with other commodities.
Wheat futures rose as much as two cents, equaling or bettering the 12-months peak reached earlier in the week, while corn was up 1 1/4-3 1/4 cents to new highs for the past four years. Lard and soybeans also were at the best levels for more than a year.
Wheat closed 1 1/2-2 cents higher, May 98 3/8, July 96 1/8-3/4; corn 1 1/4-3 1/4 cents up, May 71 1/2-3 1/4, July 72 3/8-5/8; oats 1-8-1-2 higher.
