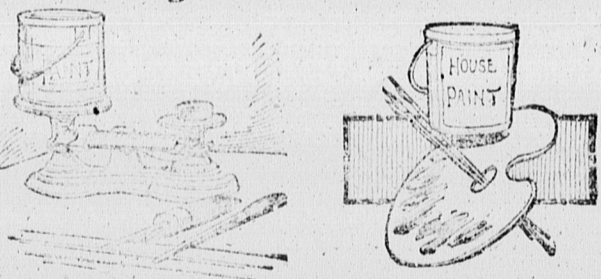

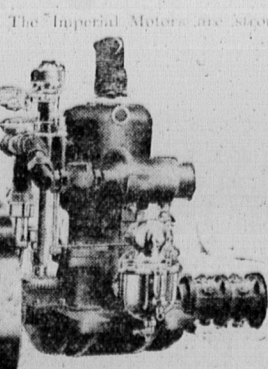

THE TUNNEL AND THE AUTOMOBILE.

Sir.—Some time ago I noticed in your paper letters in regard to the Tunnel and the Automobile Act. Some of these writers are working against their own interest in this way. Any one who does not want the Tunnel does not want to stay on this island as a farmer, as that work would be a great boon to our farmers, giving a chance to ship our products at all seasons of the year.

Some will say there is no money in farming as help cannot be got. They cannot appreciate hired help or make the best use of it. They will hire a young fellow with no experience in farming, leave him to look after the farm, and they themselves go away, contracting, digging, wells, or as agents for separators, or phonographs and neglect both the farm and their help. If they would attend to their farms and take an interest in these young men the farms that are now fast becoming vacant would in a few years be in a flourishing condition.

Some of these men say they can make money, but it is not by farming. They are killing our men that have no other way of living, and so injuring the industries and the laboring men of the Island. They would stop the automobiles from running, which, if allowed to run would be a great advantage in bringing tourists here each season, and in helping a great industry in Charlottetown in which Mr. Stewart and others are engaged. This would give more employment, and help to keep our young men in the Province. I, for one, would favor the running of automobiles, as the time is coming when men who are now working against them will find them most useful to the farmer in his work.

OBSERVATORY STATIONS.

TORONTO, April 24—Mr. Bertram Webster, assistant director of the Dominion Meteorological survey, has just returned to Toronto from an inspection of the observatory at Hamilton, Bermuda. The station there has not been visited since it was taken over by the Dominion Government four years ago. The military authorities have charge of the service.

Newfoundland's three stations, St. John's, Barin and Port Aux Basques, have been under the control of the Canadian service for several months now. Two more observations are to be established by the Newfoundland Government, one at Fogo Island and another at Domino on the Labrador Coast, about 200 miles north of the dominion station on Belle Isle.
