The largest draft in this Canadian troop convoy constituted Royal Canadian Artillery gunners who flooded the "Little Canada" camp at the grave. The gunners, making them resound with reunion greetings of soldier friends.

In capable of doing 17 1-2 knots. She will call at Toronto to re-fuel. The ferry is operated by diesel engine. She was licensed to carry 400 passengers and 20 autos.

The crossing from Wood Islands to Caribou, a distance of 15 miles, can be made in less than an hour.

Three round trips a day are scheduled with an additional crossing on Friday, Saturday and Sunday during the months of July, August and September. If conditions demand it, it is also possible that an extra crossing will be made. The boat is equipped with a cafeteria for the convenience of the passengers.

Tickets for passengers and automobiles on the Prince Nova are interchangeable with the routes of the Charlottetown car ferry which runs on the regular schedule between Borden and Cape Tormentine, N.B.

This permitting passengers to enter this province by one route and leave by the other without extra cost. Although the distance is 50 per cent greater from Wood Islands to the mainland, the rates for passengers and trucks will be the same. The boat will also be carried for less money. Trucks up to 15 feet will be taken over and back for \$3; those from 15 to 18 feet for \$4.50 and those over 18 feet at an extra cost of 10 cents per foot or fraction of a foot (single fare) and 25 cents per foot or fraction of a foot (double).

The cargo will not cost anything extra. The boat will not carry trucks which are over a certain weight or weight. The charge is on the length of these vehicles and not on the weight.

Although this boat carries less cars than the Sankaty, which was requisitioned last year before it went on the run, it is speedier.

Captain Maguire informs Mr. Much that the craft is in excellent condition for the crossing. It was rebuilt three years ago.

The Northumberland Ferries Limited are operating the boat on this crossing. The terminals, which were to have been used between Wood Islands and Caribou, were requisitioned by the Federal Government before commencing operations. The terminals were built for the ferry the summer before last but so far no boat has been on the crossing.

but there is one thing which is certain: Hitler cannot find safety from avenging justice in the Middle East or the Far East."

Instead, Mr. Churchill said, to win this war he (Hitler) must depend on the United States. "That is what is called the battle of the Atlantic, which, in order to win, we have got to win on salt water just as the Germans have to win the battle of Britain last August and September."

For this reason, the Prime Minister asserted, it was with "indestructible relief" that he heard the United States patrol decision.

"The American fleet and flying boats have been ordered to patrol the wide waters of the western hemisphere, and to warn the peaceful shipping of all nations outside the combat zone of the presence of lurking U-boats or raiding cruises belonging to the two aggressor nations."

Therefore Britain will be able to concentrate on the ocean routes, declaring fervently: "I felt for some time that something like this was bound to happen."

The battle of the Atlantic still will be "long and hard," said Mr. Churchill, but the United States is responding to his plea of 10 weeks ago. "The battle of the Atlantic is a grim but at the same time a far more favorable phase."

He stated that Americans are "taxing themselves heavily" and "gigantic" industry to making the munitions which Britain needs.

"German forces which broke through the Thermopylae line continue their advance southward, not without difficulties in view of the resistance by the rearguard of the British Imperial forces in successive battles. These troops are stopping to fight at important points from time to time. As a result the fighting, the object of which is to delay, is considered successful. However, it is pointed out that it is a question of a delayed action of rearguard, whereas it is to gain time for the main forces in Africa to slip away; that is to say, it is a struggle with a restricted time limit."

The Home Security Ministry said Saturday night the Germans occupied several places surrounding the Athens in the Attica district and points in the Peloponnese. A few casualties and slight damage was reported in the former but the reports in the latter were not available immediately because of disrupted communications.
