**FROM PULLMAN PORTER
TO MILLIONAIRE.**
America, ever the land of surprises,
has a negro Dives. His name is Watt
Terry, who at the age of 31 owns a
property worth more than \$500,000.
Born on a plantation "way down in
old Virginia," he immigrated to
Brookton as a lad, and is now one of
the town's wealthiest citizens.
As assistant janitor at a salary of
\$7.50 he saved money. Then he took
up a post as porter on a Pullman
car. But he did not like to serve
drink, and he went into a shoe fac-
tory. By attending night classes he
fitted himself to earn \$25 a week.
Then he married, and bought a little
home with his savings. He went on
savings, and eventually retired from
the factory to look after his invest-
ments.
This practice of looking after his
own property he has continued, and
by being always in touch with his
tenants he has made his real estate
pay a high percentage of profit. Re-
cently his holdings went \$50,000
above the half-million mark when he
got control of the Chesnut and
Cheekerton apartment in Wales-avenue,
Belmont and Victoria streets.
They are laid out in the form of
apartments. The price Terry paid for
shoe-board, and each contains 64
thems is said to be about \$200,000.
Watt Terry has never found social
prejudice a handicap, because he
holds very strong opinions on the
subject.
"I never have any trouble," he ex-
plained, "because I do not attempt
to mingle socially with white people.
In business life I have a great many
white friends. I mean them on an
equal business footing. But I do not
want to be entertained at their
homes, and I do not want to enter-
tain them at mine. I am perfectly
content to find my personal friends
among the members of my own race."
