INSTITUTE REPORTS

The following are some of the reports of Women's Institutes read at the Women's Institute Convention on the opening day:— Cornwall/York.—Money raised during the year, \$356.57; amount expended on schools, \$5.30; Halifax Relief, \$25.00; P. E. I. Hospital, \$33.35; Presents to boys enlisting from the district, \$5; patriotic work, \$243.89; pairs of socks, 264; 46 boxes of comforts were sent overseas.

Malpeque.—The total receipts were \$395.69; expenditure \$372.35. Nine meetings were held and an average attendance of 11. Ethel Henry, Secretary.

Meadow Bank.—Ten meetings were held. An organ was purchased for

the school, the funds being raised by a concert given by the children. 21 lbs. of yarn were bought and \$56.51 given for a prisoner of war fund, \$15 to the Halifax Relief Fund. Total amount raised \$121.12. Myrtle Crosby, Secretary.

Wellington.—There were a number of meetings held. The three great aims of the Institute are to improve our homes, our schools and our community. Besides aiding the school financially the Institute appointed monthly four members, two for each district, to visit the schools and report on same, and as a result sanitary conditions have been greatly improved.

The sum of \$212.44 was raised, which was spent for patriotic purposes. Socks and Christmas boxes were sent to soldiers. The Institute received generous support from the community. S. M. Milligan, Secretary.

Murray River.—Memberships 30; 12 meetings were held. The amount raised was \$368.25. This was forwarded to Field Comforts Circle, Red Cross Hospital, Halifax Relief Fund, Y.M.C.A. Christmas boxes were also sent and parcels, with various comforts were sent to the soldiers.

Southwest, Lot 76.—\$142.00 was raised and spent in Red Cross work 119 pairs of socks were knit, also shirts and wristlets made. A number of instructive meetings were held. Lulu McLean, Secretary.

Georgetown.—Nine Red Cross meetings were held with an average attendance of 14; also 5 special meetings. A spinning bee held during the year realized \$40. 55 parcels were sent overseas, containing socks, can-
