The Duke of Comanchet, Governor General of Canada. A large number of members came together in the hall and spent a very enjoyable evening. He also mentioned the fact that Kansas State in U.S.A. enforces prohibition more than any other state and the following figures show the truth of this statement.—In the year 1912 the consumption of liquor in Kansas State averaged one hundredth part of a gallon per capita, while in Missouri, a neighboring state it had reached thirty-six gallons per capita. He explained that the reason for this was the fourteen words added to the Constitution of Kansas State, which were:—"The importation and manufacture of intoxicating liquors shall be forever prohibited in this State."
