RUSSIA'S REVOLUTIONARY STRIKES AND TROUBLES

The Duma Appoints an Agrarian Commission of Ninety-nine Members—Its Members Calmly Pursuing their Work—Mutiny is Feared in the Fleet at Cronstadt and Breach-Blocks Removed From the Guns—Many Newspapers Confiscated.

ST. PETERSBURG, June 19.—(Special)—The Bialyok massacre did not figure in the proceedings of the Lower House today.

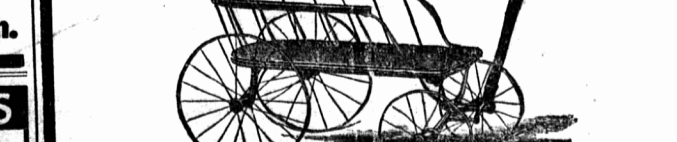
