Dennism, Sir John Bourinot, Prof. Goldwin Smith, Sir Charles Tupper, Archbishop Langevin, Rev. Principal Grant, Wm. Louis Frechette, Hon. J. W. Longley, Rev. Dr. Potts, Mr. Nicholas, Flood Davin, Dr. George Stewart and Dr. George B. Parkin. Appended to each contribution is the portrait and a fac simile of the writer. Several well-written romances, a description sketch On Board a Cattle Ship, a side splitting humorous story in rhyme and dialect, The Tragedy of the Sway-backed Pinto, stories for little people, poetry, &c., make up the bulk of the other contents.
