SIX HUNDRED COTTON SPINNERS

On Strike In Montreal on Demand For Twenty-five Per Cent More Wages.

MONTEAL, May 2.—(Special)—Upwards of six hundred operatives are on strike at the Hochelaga Mills of the Dominion Textile Company today. A general advance of 25 per cent in wages of the operatives has been demanded. The Company is willing to consider 10 per cent but the strikers do not consider that sufficient.

THE MARATHON RACE WINNER

Honored by King George and Cabled a Thousand Dollars by Friends.

ATHENS, May 2.—(Special)—With royal honors the Olympic Games came to an end today in presence of an immense gathering. Sherring, the Canadian winner of the Marathon Race, was presented by the King with a beautiful statue of Minerva. The result of the games places Americans far in the lead. Their score was seventy-five, while the British scored thirty-nine and the Swedes and Greeks tied for third place with twenty-eight.
