## FACTS AND FIGURES

Sir,—People are slow to comprehend the immensity of the burden laid on their shoulders by the liquor traffic. Some time ago I made the statement that it cost five times as much to look after the mischief wrought by the liquor traffic as the revenue it receives from it. I also said that if the money spent in drink were spent in useful articles, it would give employment to eight times as many men as are now engaged in the manufacture of liquor. I was immediately asked for proof. That was easily done because I only stated what anyone can demonstrate mathematically for themselves. But that is much less than the real facts. Everyone knows that there is a great deal of expenditure and loss that cannot be calculated. For instance, very few know how much they give to private charities that are to a great extent made necessary by the drink habit. Losses by sickness, death, loss of time, loss by bad debts, etc., cannot be estimated. So that instead of being five times, it may possibly be double that amount.  
"Members of the Dauphin County Board of Poor Directors, Pennsylvania have announced that during the year 1914 they had received from the liquor traffic costs Dauphin County including the City of Harrisburg, more than five times as much as the revenue receives from the business. The revenue of the City and County from the liquor business amounts to \$34,315.00 while the two governments spend \$186,000.00 in partially remedying the harm that liquor does." Other places report a similar proportion.  
Professor Longacre of Washington, D. C. speaking at Atlantic City recently, said: "The liquor traffic is a revenue consumer. It takes five times as much care for the criminals, paupers and orphans for which the saloons is responsible as the amount of the revenues paid to the government by the breweries and distilleries."  
"From a Government report we find that there are 4,688 persons engaged in the breweries and distilleries. We also learn that there is one person engaged in useful industries for every \$2,582 invested. From these figures anyone can prove that the hundred million dollars spent in drink would give employment to eight times four thousand and six hundred and eighty-eight. And if you add to this the amount invested in liquor manufacture, the sum total would give employment to nearly twelve times the number of men employed in the breweries and distilleries. In every way the liquor traffic is the enemy of labor, a burden on the sober man and a menace to the nation. We pin our faith to facts. Give the people the plain, unvarnished facts and they will soon settle this question. Everyone can help in this fight against an enemy worse than the Germans, by taking the "Pioneer" or any other temperance paper and when he has read it, handing it to his neighbor. I am Sir, etc.

## CONSCRIPTION TO BRING TRADE REVIVAL

LONDON, Sept. 18.—The Executive Committee of the Amalgamated Union of Railwaymen has unanimously endorsed today the motion in the House of Commons on Thursday of J. H. Thomas that conscription would bring on an industrial revolution and that the railway workers would stop work.  
NEW YORK, Sept. 3.—That Dr. Dumba's period of tarrying in this country should be made as short as possible, and that when he goes Captain Von Papen, colonel of "those idiotic Yankees" phrase, should go with him, is the conviction expressed in editorial comment in America newspapers this morning. Some newspapers also express the view that the relations in the document statement from James F. J. Archibald in England, warrant a demand for the recall to Court Von Bernstorff.

## BOMBS STRUCK U. S. CONSULATE AT STUTTGART

STUTT-GART, Germany, Sept. 23.—During the air raid by French aviators over Stutt-Gart this morning fragments of bombs struck the American Consulate. Consul Higgins and other occupants of the building were not injured.
