THE GUARDIAN'S correspondent in the western part of the Province writes: While the central and western parts of the Province have had snow and lightning for some time, neither struck in here till the 19th, considerably later than the average. This exemption is due to the proximity of the waters of the Gulf, yet comparatively warm. Eel and smelt fishing has been prosecuted with fair success in North and West Rivers and Basin. Considerable value has been taken out of these small streams, a source of income unknown and unthought of a few years ago. Seth McLellan and Lester Roberts landed a dory load of codfish at 14 1/2. Head on the 16th, some of them of very large size. They also captured a shark of the largest kind, and brought his tail as one as a trophy of their prowess. As it lies is now about closed for the year the catch is below the average. It appears as if the ice which lies so long in our waters in the spring, turned the great schools of fish, which enter the gulf every spring, in some other direction, possibly to the Grand Banks, where the catches were unusually good. However, the prices were high, and the Souris fish dryer as usual, hauled the fish with speed and dispatch.
