ADDRESS TO JUDGE FRASER

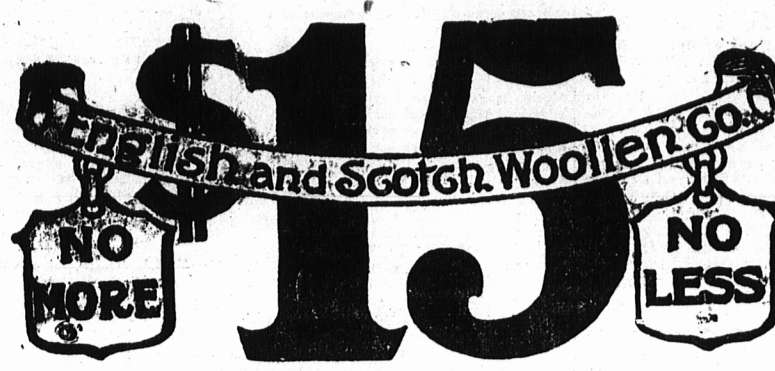

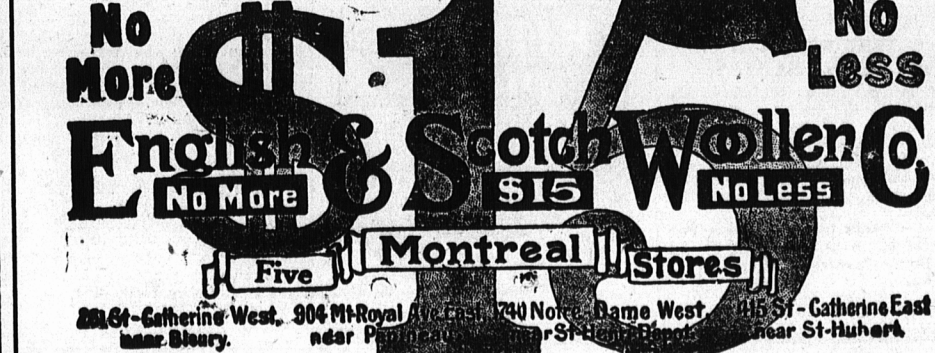
