THE NEW SLAVE TRADE OF AFRICA

Some Description of the Conditions in King Leopold's Possessions—The Subject of Much Protest of Late Years by Many Persons.

LONDON Feb. 28.—A writer in the Christian view. The forests in which the rubber vine grows are unhealthy to a degree, and the gathering of the rubber is thus described by King Leopold's own commission:—There the collector passes a number of days in a miserable existence, has not the food to which he is accustomed (that is, he has to live on leaves and roots) . . . is exposed to inclemencies of weather and the attacks of wild beasts; only then can he return to his village, where he can sojourn for barely more than two or three days, because the new demand for the rubber is so great that he is unable to leave the forest to till his ten-pound basket, the cruel lash will probably be used to accelerate his pace, and his relatives be punished by brutal soldiery. One such case will ever live in my memory. It was about ten o'clock in the morning, just at the close of our service, when an aged widow woman rushed frantically to us. The old story! The village was short of rubber; therefore black-armed men were let loose to strike terror into the hearts of the villagers. A woman named Ndombi, being 'encanted,' was unable to escape; but her condition was not pitied, for she was tied to a tree and a large bullet tore its track through her. The poor widow Wangu was mesoquent at her own loss. 'On sa ja bon-toko Nzakumba.' 'Help, O man of God! What shall I do? My children are now quite finished. Long ago, Mpuin, and Mboya, have all been shot this morning.' Lord Lansdowne's measured language truly described the state of affairs in the Congo: 'A bondage under the most barbarous and inhuman conditions, and maintained for mercenary motives of the most selfish character.'

Will the reader look upon an actual scene? The villagers of Wanganya, unable to satisfy the white overseer, have been punished. Near to a burned hut are stretched the charred bodies of three defenceless women, tied together and shot with one bullet, before being burned. In the houses of the village hang portions of a human body, the body of the Chief Binkanga, first shot, then cut up in pieces, the village being decorated, therewith, to strike terror into the hearts of his people.

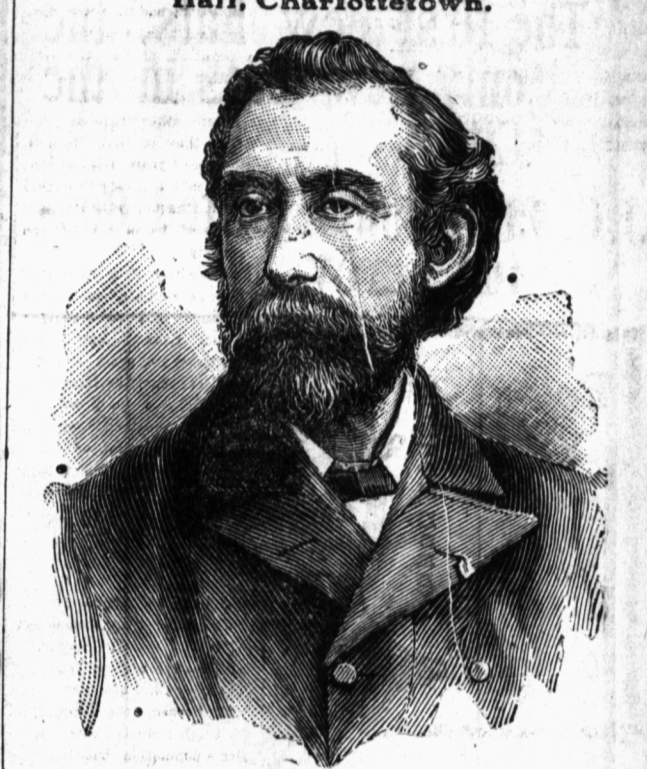
