Twenty-three persons were indicted recently by a Federal Grand Jury after a long investigation in which the Navy Intelligence Service, Department of Justice and New York police joined.

Suing Wesley College For \$30,000 WINNIPEG, Dec 22—Claiming \$50,000 damages for alleged wrongful dismissal, Prof. W. G. Smith has entered suit against Wesley College here. He has registered a statement of claim in the King's Bench and the announcement is made that the college board has decided unanimously to fight the claim.

Attempt Made To Burn College MONTREAL, Dec 22—According to a statement made this morning by Chief Boulianne, head of the police and fire departments of the municipality of Pointe Aux Trembles, an attempt was made last night to burn down the Presbyterian College at that place, where 250 French boys and girls receive religious instruction.

Explosion In St. John Elevator ST. JOHN, N.B., Dec 22—The concrete grain elevator of the Canadian Pacific Railway at Sand Point was damaged this morning by an explosion which blew out the sides of the upper portion of the big structure. While the damage to the building appeared to be large, a close examination disclosed the machinery intact and only the sides of the building injured.

Trains Running Behind Time. BOSTON, Dec 22—Through trains from Canadian cities to Boston arrived here today greatly behind schedule owing to difficulties of operation caused by severe weather. In many cases times had been lost before the trains were delivered to the Boston and Maine.

A TIMELY SUGGESTION ON COMMUNITY WELFARE Rev. E. M. Malone Describes Women's Self-Help Organization in Barbadoes and Recommends the Plan for This Province. In a very interesting address before the Rotary Club Thursday afternoon Rev. E. M. Malone, rector of St. Peter's Cathedral gave an outline of the plans for a community welfare scheme which he had found to be a remarkable success in the West Indies.

It could be made a centre for disseminating information about the province and it would be a useful addition to the life of the community.

The speaker confined his suggestion to one phase of the question, which was a plan for developing a sort of community centre. It would be self-supporting, from the practical standpoint, "good business." From his own experience he knew that such an organization paid.
