STANDARD OIL COMPANY TRIAL

Much Legal Argument But Very Little Progress Made
---Step Daughter of Late George M. Rice an Interesting Witness---Document in Evidence.

FINLAY, O., Oct. 11.—Much legal argument and little actual progress marked the second day of the trial of the Standard Oil Co., of Ohio, for conspiracy against trade. The argument was caused by the objection of the attorneys for the Standard to the character of evidence sought to be placed before the jury by the prosecution. In every instance, however, the ruling of Judge Banker favored the prosecution.

The result was that the testimony of John D. Rockefeller, given in 1900 in the litigation against the Standard Oil Trust before the supreme court of the state was admitted and carefully read to the jury by Attorney Phelps for the prosecution. This consumed the morning's session and part of the afternoon.

Mrs. Ida M. Butts, the first witness of the trial, was then called to the stand. Mrs. Butts said she was the step-daughter of the late George M. Rice, an independent oil refiner of Marietta, Ohio. She had also acted as Mr. Rice's private secretary and was the executrix of his estate. She produced at the request of Attorney Phelps, the certificates of original trust stock owned by Mr. Rice and scrip showing title to fractional shares of stock in all of the twenty subsidiary companies of the original trust. The text of these certificates was read into the record and Mrs. Butts excused.

The final wrangle of the day began and lasted until adjournment at 4.30. It resulted when Mr. Phelps offered as evidence a certified copy of the record in the office of the Secretary of State of New Jersey, showing that in 1898 the Standard Oil Co. of that state changed its corporate existence by increasing the number of its directors from three to nine. It was argued by the defense that this certificate was unauthorized and incompetent. Judge Banker reserved ruling on this point until tomorrow.

Attorney General Ellis made his first appearance as an active participant in the prosecution, and by Attorney Phelps. The defense is taken care of by Attorneys Elliott, Kline, Troup and Toils.

Answering the objection of Mr. Kline that the prosecution was going outside the pleadings in the case, Mr. Phelps said the Valentine law, under which the suit was brought, was as broad as the world and as strong as Sampson; that under it there was no necessity of forming a trust agreement or naming the parties in any trade conspiracy. It was enough to show the result of that conspiracy. However, it was the intention of the prosecution to show that the nine men who formed originally the Standard Oil Trust of 1888 have ever since, at least all of them who are living—continued to dominate the oil industry of the state; that they abandoned the trust agreement when compelled to do so by the state only to enter another firm in New Jersey, which now continues.

Mr. Kline opposed this with the assertion that there was no law prohibiting the stockholders of the Standard Oil Company of Ohio from selling their stock to a New Jersey corporation. He further pointed out that the subsidiary companies named in the complaint were all declared by the prosecution to be under the same ownership, hence how could there be a conspiracy such as is condemned by the Valentine anti-trust law. The right of the New Jersey Company to own the stock of any other company, he said, could not be questioned in an Ohio court and he asserted that the only evi-

dence which was competent for the prosecution to bring forward was evidence showing a conspiracy against trade by the defendant companies in Hancock county, Ohio.

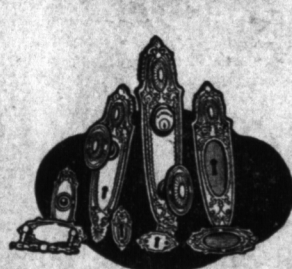
