Mr. Clarkin's Death.

Wednesday afternoon of last week our community were greatly shocked by the drowning accident.

Mr. E. Clarkin, shipping clerk in the office of the Manufacturing Investment Co., was drowned while bathing behind the pulp mill, Wednesday afternoon, July 27, at about 3 o'clock.

He was in habit of bathing there and inform one of the men of his intention of so doing.

When he had been gone an hour anxiety was felt regarding him and search was made.

His clothes were on the shore and going out in a boat his body was found in about eight feet of water.

Ed Stewart dove from the boat and brought him to the surface. Everything was done to resuscitate him but to no avail.

He was a general favorite among the young men of the village and had been in the employ of the Investment Co., for three years.

His age was 21 years 3 months and 6 days.

He leaves to mourn his loss three brothers and one sister, also several half brothers and sisters.

His sister was in Boston at the time of his death and came to this village to accompany M. E. Clarkin with the remains to Charlottetown, P. E. I. the home of the family.

Mr. Clarkin and his brother are both members of the I. O. F.—Bombsizeen, No. 3271. The order attendant the remains to the afternoon train Friday and the funeral took place Sunday under the charge of the lodge at Charlottetown.
