Destroying the Children.

Do American men and woman realize that in five cities of our country alone there were during the last school term over sixteen thousand children between the age of eight and fourteen taken out of the public schools because their nervous systems were wrecked, and their minds were incapable of going on any further in the infernal cramming system which exists to-day in our schools? It is putting the truth mildly to state that, of all American institutions, that which deals with the public education of our children is at once the most faulty, the most unintelligent and most cruel."

Young Astor Kept From War.

LONDON, Jan. 16.—William Waldorf Astor's eldest son ardently desired to volunteer for service in South Africa with the Imperial Yeomanry in company with several of his companions, but his father refused to allow him to do so. Young Astor is said to feel his position keenly, as it is quite the cult among his college comrades to volunteer, and those who stay behind lose caste.

Astor's friends regard his refusal as a mistake, for service in this war by his eldest son would establish his position as an English citizen in a way that even the handsome donation to war funds cannot do.

In one direction or another Mr. Astor has already given nearly \$70,000 to war charities. Alfred Beit, however, heads the list of millionaire donors with \$250,000 to the Imperial Yeomanry and \$25,000 to other funds.

A \$200,000 DEFICIT.

is What, It is Said, the Greenway Government Dropped out of Power With.

A despatch to the Toronto World (Conservative) says:—It is asserted that the finances of the Province are in a much worse state than represented by the Green way Government. School grants amounting to some \$85,000 have to be paid, and there are also elections expenses and other current accounts chargeable to 1899, aggregating a deficit of \$200,000.

The Provincial account at the bank is considerably overdrawn. One account places the overdraft at \$65,000. Previous to leaving office the Greenway Government concluded several large railway contracts, the particulars of which will be revealed in an investigation which is to be made.
