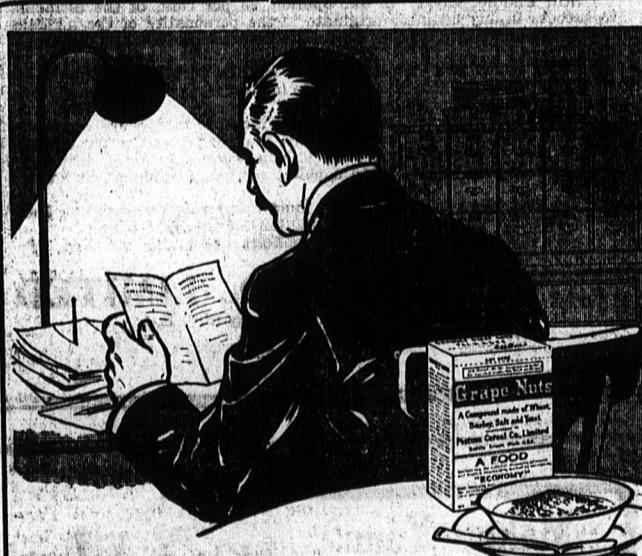

PROVISION FOR RETURNED SOLDIERS
Wounded Soldiers will be Met on Arrival and Sent to Hospital or Convalescent Homes

OTTAWA, June 24.—The Government has decided on a plan under which all returned soldiers requiring hospital or other treatment on their return to Canada will be met immediately upon their debarkation at a Canadian port and looked after. The work will be done through the establishment of a special committee including a medical man. All returned soldiers will be met under this plan. Those who are wounded will be sent to hospitals or convalescent homes and others to employment organizations if they need work.
