LOSSES ARE GENERAL ON M.T.L. MARKET

(C. P. By Guardian's Special Wire) MONTREAL, Feb. 6.—After a burst of activity shortly after the opening that promised to reach into proportions sufficient to lift the market out of the doldrums where it has been lingering for several days, the Montreal Stock Exchange fell back into its former lethargic trend today and prices drifted lower.

Losses were general throughout the list with the index of 10 utilities and 20 industrials dropping 5 1/2 to 60.2. Volume picked up slightly from the past few days but the total turnover was still considerably below normal.
