MINTO COAL MINERS STRUCK TODAY

FREDERICTON, Dec. 9.—The strike of the miners at the Minto Coal Company's mines at Minto, in the Grand Lake coal area, went into effect this morning and the mines are not in operation.
At a meeting of the Minto branch of the United Mine Workers of America, which was held last night following the return from the eastern U. M. W. headquarters at Cape Breton of William Hayes, board member of Springhill, N. S., who is in charge of the situation at Minto, a strike vote was taken and the miners, following the advice of the U. M. W. officers, voted to quit work at once.
This morning none of the miners went down into the shafts and there was no work being carried on except such as is done by men working on the surface at the Minto Coal Com-

pany's mines, although the strike has not affected the other mining companies in the Grand Lake district. There had been no trouble of even an unimportant character as a result of the walkout up to noon today, although the United Mine Workers had started a system of picketing and had representatives stationed along the roadway leading to the mines.
Officials of the Minto Coal Company asserted that at least one instance had been reported to their office of the pickets interfering with men who wanted to work, this being the case of a man who was going up to the stripping area. This man reported that he had been stopped by the pickets and advised not to go to work. He turned back at the time, it was stated, but later went to work at the stripping operations.
