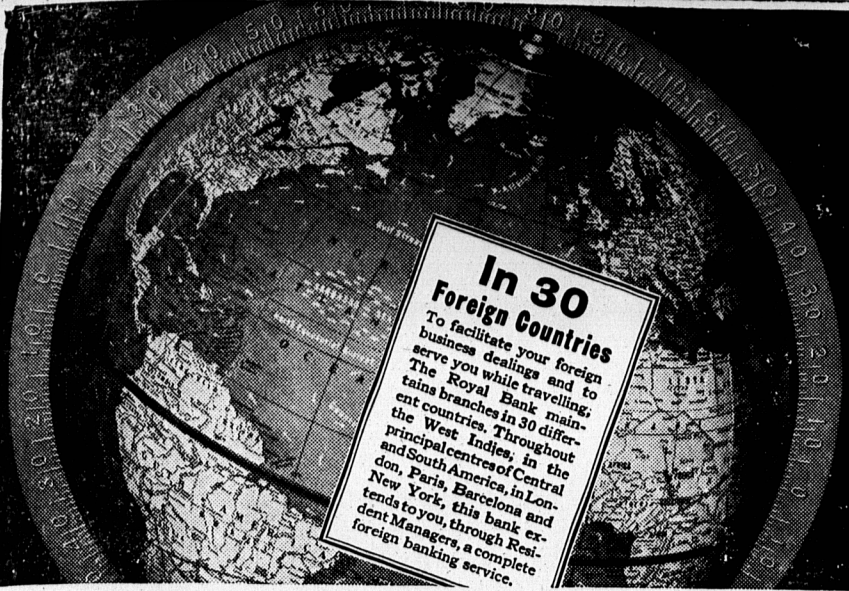

Currencies

NEW YORK, Sept. 29.—(CP)—The pound sterling appreciated slightly in foreign exchange dealings today, furnishing the bulk of business in a market still sharply restricted because of uncertainty over the rate of devaluation of the French franc.

In New York sterling gained a cent in the day's transactions to close at 4.95 3/4. Quotations on French francs ranged all the way from 5.25 cents to about 5.50 cents, with the close at 5.58, up 0.32 of a cent. France for Wednesday's delivery were reported as high as 5 7/8 cents.

The Canadian dollar ended at par higher by 1-2 of a cent. In London the United States dollar closed at 4.95 to the pound compared with the New York overnight rate of 4.94 3/4.

MONTREAL, Sept. 29.—(CP)—Egg prices displayed firmness on Montreal open produce markets today but other lines ruled quietly steady.

Graded egg shipments in carlots or less were quoted at 31 cents a dozen for a-large, 29 for a-medium, 24 for A pullets, 23 for B and 20 for C.

Butter was quoted at 24 1-4 cents per pound for carlots or less of no. 1 while lots to retailers were 25 1-2 for solids and 26 for prints. MONTREAL, Sept. 29.—(CP)—Montreal Livestock markets continued to display a steady to strong tendency today in all divisions. Volume was light.

Receipts: cattle, 61; calves, 365; hogs, 1163; sheep, 655. Bulls were strong at \$2.25 to \$2.75 for bolognas with medium quality up to \$3. Other grades maintained yesterday's level.

Calves were steady with good veals around \$8, medium good from \$7.50 to \$7.75. Fair to medium calves ranged from \$6 to \$7, common drinkers \$4 to \$4.25 and grassers \$3.25 to \$4.

Heavy calves were slow sellers. Good ewes and wethers traded at \$7.25, buck lambs \$6.25 and culls \$5.24. Sheep were \$2 to \$4. Bacon hogs, fed and watered, went at \$8.50 with some sales, off trucks, at \$8.62. Selects drew a premium of \$1. Butchers and heavies were \$8 and extra heavies \$7.50. Light hogs sold at \$7.50 to \$8 and sows \$6 to \$7.

MINING

TORONTO, Sept. 29.—The Toronto Mines share market appeared decidedly peppy in the early trading today, on the leadership of a group of the secondary goods, but it backed tracked later and closed weak. The gold group dropped all the gain as measured by the index while other groups clung to a gain of about a point. Volume was the smallest for a full session since Aug. 31. O'Brien stepped back into spotlight, trading in heavy volume with the price climbing to 6.15 hurried covering by short traders appeared to account for five-cent jumps between sales. The close at 5.90 gave a net gain of 60 cents for the day. Pickle Grow advanced 30 cents, Mining Corporation 18 cents, Darkwater 15 cents and Toburn 12.
