STOCK QUOTATIONS

Stock Markets New York At A Glance Exchange

CHICAGO, Dec. 23 — (AP) — The momentum on Friday's upward swing in May rye carried into Saturday's session with advances of around two cents a bushel most of the time.

The buyers neglected the September delivery, however, and it showed fractional losses after advancing around four cents Friday.

WINNIPEG, Dec. 23 — (CP) — Firmness at Chicago stimulated buying in rye futures bringing out a good demand.

Locals and commission house buyers were moderately active while American interests were after the July future.

TORONTO, Dec. 23 — (CP) — Stock trading drifted into a pre-holiday quiet tempo in the last week and while volume decreased the price tone held strong. Mining groups held substantial index gains and the western oils finished lower.

Reversal of trading interest in the junior golds was definitely noticeable and many of these netted sizable gains. The higher-price golds held steady. Quebec was a feature as it climbed \$2.50 to a new high at \$18.25 in the final session of the week, presumably on the support of drilling results.

Giant Yellowknife also netted a smart gain and some of the cheaper Yellowknife issues fell into line with smaller gains.

NEW YORK, Dec. 23 — (AP) — Short covering and reinstatement of soldout accounts gave selected stocks a good lift Saturday after the market had staggered through a generally losing week.

From the start of the final session demand centered on Motors, Steels, Rails, Metals, merchandises and specialties. Medium and low-quoted issues came out in sizable blocks but dealings, on the whole, were light. Gains of fractions to two or more points were widespread at the close with a few "thin" issues achieving much wider jumps.

Adding the automotive group and sentiment elsewhere was the General Motors-union agreement to resume negotiations in an effort to settle the strike.

The Associated Press 60-stock composite was up 5/8 of a point at 75 but on the week was down 1/2 points.

CHRISTMAS DINNER ON TRAIN FOR CANADIAN SERVICEMEN RETURNING FROM OVERSEAS

On Christmas Day 270 Canadian servicemen will arrive in Halifax from overseas on the "Lady Rodney", according to the Department of National Defence, Ottawa. Although they won't get home for the day's festivities, they will enjoy Christmas dinner—the first Canadian Christmas dinner in as many as six years for many of them.

The twelve-car Canadian National Railway's Christmas Day troop special will serve turkey, cranberry sauce, plum pudding, fruit and "all the trimmings" that go with enjoying the holiday dinner at home. C.N.R. sleeping and dining car officials say.

It has been reported that this will be the last trip the "Lady Rodney" will make repatriating servicemen. She and her sister ship, the "Lady Nelson", it is anticipated will in future bring to new Canadian homes the overseas wives and children of Canada's servicemen.
