Bonn, Germany, Jan. 15th, 1919.

Dear Sister: I now take the pleasure of writing you a few lines to let you know that I am well hoping to find you all the same. I received the two letters you wrote the last one saying you had mailed me a parcel. I got the letter a week or so ago and I kept a look out for the box, so last night it arrived O. K. and everything was just lovely. The fruit cake was nice and moist for being on the road

so long and it tasted so much like home. We never get any cake like that in this country and the tobacco came in good for I was out of smokes at the time, so I was eating cake, smoking and chewing Spearmint gum all at the same time, ha ha therefore I can't express to you what a treat it really was. Well you told me to ask Alf Chapman if he got the box Vera sent him, I asked him the other day and he said he did not get any yet. It is not likely he will get it on account of not having his number, it's too bad after acting to be trouble of sending a box. Well Sister this is a very nice place we are in now and the weather is like summertime home. It seems so strange at this time of the year for it must be very cold there now. We have good bills here to stay in.

have not had any mail from home lately but expect some soon and hope that the old folks are well, and getting along all right.

Well dear sister, the time seems to pass very slowly here for we are expecting to get home sometime next summer but of course we don't know when. I do hope it will soon roll along. 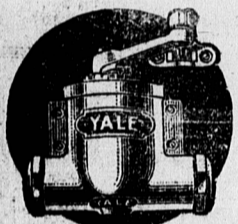
