DR GORDON THIRTY-FIVE YEARS IN THE MINISTRY.

MONTREAL, Oct. 10.—Thirty-five years ago Saturday, Rev Dr J. A. Gordon, pastor of the First Baptist Church, was ordained to the ministry and yesterday was the thirty-fifth anniversary of his first sermon after ordination. In all these thirty-five years of service Dr Gordon has missed preaching, including both illness and holidays, no less than thirty Sundays. He has during his ministry baptised no less than three thousand persons, and among them were thirty-one young men who afterwards entered the ministry.

At the Sunday morning service, Dr Gordon made a brief reference to these facts and to some other features of his period of service in the ministry. He lived, he said, through a great period of service in the ministry. He had lived, he said, through a great period of unrest in theological thought. Never, probably, in all history had there been a quarter century of such rapid change. He had made it his practice, during all his ministry to spend six hours a day—one-quarter of his time—in the study to keep abreast of the progress of thought, but he warned his congregation against the spirit of compromise in regard to the truth. "Do not trust a man who will compromise his convictions in regard to the truth," said he. "You cannot depend upon him not compromising your interests." Dr Gordon expressed his thankfulness to God for the service with which he had been honored, but added a hope that he would yet be able to labor much more in the cause of the Master.

Dr Gordon's subject for his sermon was "Victorious Love," and his text was Romans 8:31-39. He emphasized the love of God for us as the central force in life. It was, he said, the sun and atmosphere of spiritual life. "Without the love of God," he declared, "we would have Hell on earth through the selfishness of man. If that love were withdrawn, man's spiritual life would wither and die just as would wither and die all life if the sun and air were taken away." (Dr Gordon is the father of J. P. Gordon of this City.)

TRADE IDLENESS IS LESS THAN IN 1909.

ALBANY, N. Y., Oct. 11.—A labor market in better condition than in 1909 and vastly improved over 1908 will be shown by the figures for the first six months of 1910, to be presented in the forthcoming quarterly bulletin of the State Department of Labor.

Returns as to unemployed in about 190 trade unions throughout the State show for a total of between 90,000 and 100,000 members, or nearly one-fourth of the organized wage earners in the State. At the end of January the percentage of members reported idle was 23.5. Following the usual course in the transition from winter to summer conditions, the percentage declined until it stood for the end of June at 15.4, with an average percentage for the six months at 19.2. These figures are two to three points lower than those for the corresponding period of 1909, when the percentage of idleness at the end of June was 17.4 and the average for the six months was 22.3, and they are but little more than half the record high figures in the depression of 1908, when the corresponding percentages for end of June and the six months average were 30.2 and 34.7.

The idleness reported includes all kinds, whether due to labor disputes or disability or the state of trade as affected by weather or business. Idleness under the latter head is considered the only unemployment.

Idleness in consequence of strikes or lockouts in the first six months of 1910 was considerably greater than in 1909.

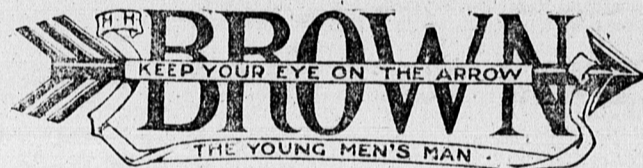

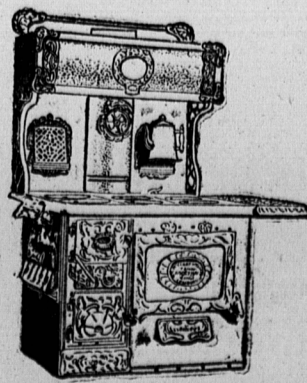
