(By The Canadian Press) MONTREAL, Jan. 26—The old blazer around town now, made brighter for Montreal Canadiens Saturday night, added home a pair of goals to lead his team to a 4-1 win over Boston Bruins before a crowd of 11,688 National Hockey League fans.
