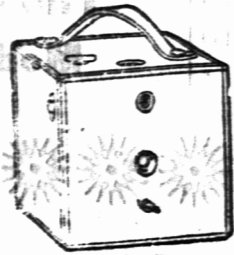

Much has already been said through the press and elsewhere, and much more might be said, about the now notorious Summerside Railway wharf, but it looks as if something more were yet needed to bring about a reform. Some weeks ago—through certain promises, the belief became current that the long talked of sidewalk would be built, but summer is passing, the heaviest part of the tourist business is over, or will be shortly, and patrons of the Railway wharf, and visitors to the Island are still obliged to wade through the mud, and the chances of being run over by trains or teams, while Summerside is obliged to bear the reputation of being the slowest town in North America. If Summerside had a board of trade or some other representative institution that would insist on its rights, and continue insisting until its just demands were granted this condition of affairs could not exist. As it is—interested citizens should insist on the Government either putting the wharf in decent shape or refusing to do so, and then govern themselves accordingly. The government estimates of a few days ago, show grants of amounts ranging from \$1000 to \$5500 for wharves on obscure creeks in Quebec, and dog trails to the Yukon, but it takes years to get a plank sidewalk for one of the most important railway wharves in P. E. Island. It is a humiliating to citizens who try to feel a pride in their town and county to listen to the unanswerable comments of visitors on the wretched accommodations afforded by this wharf, and the town is inexcusably recreant to its best interests in permitting such a disgraceful condition to exist. Summerside must wake up.

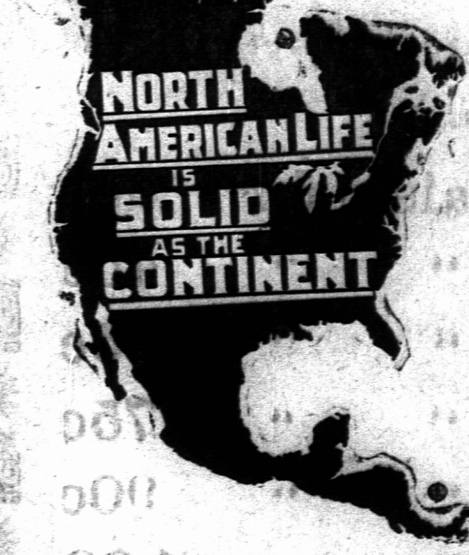
