FEELING OVER HOME RULE BILL

Government Nearing the Important Question—A Wordy War Sure

(By Lady Henry Somerset.)

LONDON, Feb. 22.—As the Government nears the crucial question, namely the Irish Home Rule bill, the differences between political parties in England become more acrimonious.

"Ireland," it has been truly said by Mr. Stowe, "has been the despair and disgrace of the Empire," and the responsibility for the fact that Irish affairs have been for so long in chaos, rests mainly on the House of Lords. England, Scotland and Wales have been governed by the House of Commons. Ireland has been abandoned to the tender mercies of the House of Lords.

To any who can afford to stand and take an outside point of view of the English position, the Irish question appears to be one which is far less intricate than we are usually led to suppose. It is peculiarly a Catholic question. Eight Irishmen out of ten belong to the Roman Catholic Church. Little wonder, therefore, that if the government is carried on by an alien religion, difficulty and discontent should always ensue.

When Mr. Pitt brought in a Catholic Emancipation bill as one of the great conditions of the Union, it was the House of Lords who fought bitterly against it, the concession. The history of Irish legislation has been the history of opposition from the Upper House, and the legislation which must be introduced in 1907 will probably be no exception. The struggle in England at this moment is between peers and people.

The House of Commons is hopelessly clogged and broken down by business of which the Second Chamber should relieve it, but the attitude of our Second Chamber makes it impossible. That the House of Lords, will have to be reformed on lines which will in a measure approximate to the conditions which obtain in the selection of second Chambers in other countries, I think, undoubtedly.

The war which shall rage and the Irish question will possibly hinder a great deal of the useful legislation the present government desires to undertake. The establishment of children's courts has been fore-shadowed by the Home Secretary. In this we are following the example of America, and all those who are interested in the welfare of children sincerely desire to see an amendment in due manner of dealing with infant delinquents.

THE SNOW OF THE RIVER NILE

LONDON, Feb. 23.—The Duke of Abuzzi recently gave a lecture before the Royal Geographical Society in London on his discoveries and travels in the mountains of South Africa. The King was present and congratulated the Duke after the lecture. The lantern slides in connection with the lecture revealed awe-inspiring views. The London papers devoted considerable space to the lecture and the weeklies just to hand contain many of the views.

The London Telegraph, in its report of the lecture, says: "An enormous cliff of rock reminded one of the difficulties of mountaineers who were pursuing their way over an untried path, and gnarled trunks of fallen forest giants told of the force of winds which blow in this high region, and the constantly recurring cloud effects brought home to all the ever-present peril of being caught fog bound on a glacier. Some photographs, taken from different points were passed quickly through the lantern and they portrayed the surpassing beauty of the range. There were few views—many of the audience thought too few—of the exploring party themselves. This was in keeping with the extreme modesty of the lecturer, for the Duke never referred to his ascent of the various peaks as an achievement."
