

ROCKEFELLER CARELESS IN BUSINESS.

CLEVELAND, Ohio, Dec. 3.—The careless business methods of John Rockefeller and four associates placed in peril for 31 years the property of his favorite place of worship, the Euclid Avenue Baptist Church, in this city.

In 1879 the five trustees of the church, including Mr. Rockefeller, decided to change the name of the church from the Second Baptist. They ignored, however, the necessity of carrying out the legal formalities since that time several donations have been made to the church, including a piece of property by the oil magnate.

A few months ago the attorney for the trustees discovered that all the donations were invalid as they were made to a church which had no legal nomination. A hasty call was issued to the congregation and last night the necessary legal steps were completed to ratify the change in name.

The Canadian Northern Railway Company has been frequently mentioned in these columns as a great corporation which is rapidly developing in Canada the third transcontinental railway system of the Dominion. It is but a few years since Messrs Mackenzie and Mann, its energetic projectors and builders, began the creation of the Canadian Northern system. It has grown with incomparable rapidity until now more than 7,000 miles of splendidly equipped railway are in operation. Their lines cover the three prairie Provinces, and afford one of the main outlets from the grain country to the Great Lakes.

Westward to the Pacific Coast the extension of their system is under contract. Their steamships on the lakes connect with their railway lines in Ontario. These within a year will be connected with their lines throughout Quebec. They own a line in Cape Breton and another running down the Atlantic coast of Nova Scotia from Halifax to Yarmouth. Iron and coal mines of vast extent and value, pulp mills and other industries, and palatial hotels are added to their railway interests as subsidiary supports and contributors to the traffic of their great railway system.

The fathers of the confederation bound the Provinces together with a constitution engrossed on parchment. An equally important work of consolidation was that of the great railway builders who linked Province to Province by bands of steel, spiked down and fastened to the solid earth, over which the trains, like busy shuttles of our inland commerce ply to and fro from east to west and from west to east. The Canadian Northern is preparing for an extension of their system by steamship lines on the Atlantic and the Pacific, linking together the Dominion and the Mother Country and with other Dominions and with foreign lands.

On Tuesday evening last a banquet was given at Halifax on board the splendid ocean steamship, the Royal Edward, at which were present many of the leading representatives of the three Maritime Provinces. The Royal Edward is the pioneer of the Canadian Northern line on the Atlantic.

The fair fame of the Town and of the Province has been smirched and must be cleared. The blood of repeated victims of the unholy traffic cries from the ground. In the words of the prophet, the stone

cries out of the wall, and the beam out of the timber answers it with a "woe" against this murderous trade. The remedy is to search out and bring to justice the miserable wretches who are engaged in it, and until this is done a fearful responsibility rests upon the Government and upon all connected with the administration and enforcement of the Prohibitory Law.

Canada's export of cheese this year will run up to over \$17,000,000, besides a large home consumption. An estimate of the cheese produced in this Province is \$450,000.

The election in the Mother Country promises to be very close. With 354 seats heard from at this writing—more than half of the total—the Government party's majority is but 14. This is far too close for ministerial comfort.

By the unexpectedly large vote of 41 to 7—nearly six to one—the Presbytery of Prince Edward Island has approved the basis of union with the Methodist and Congregational churches. The minority is strong in ability and conviction, but here its numbers are obviously limited. So events move forward toward union, and all will join in the hope that when these churches are united they may be able to "keep house" together in concord and live happily ever afterward.
