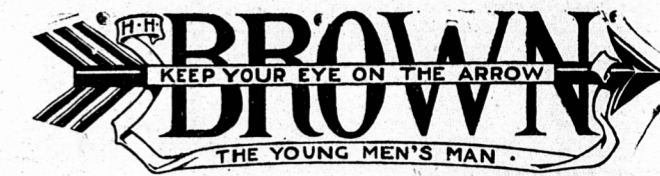

MYSTERIOUS BODY FOUND.

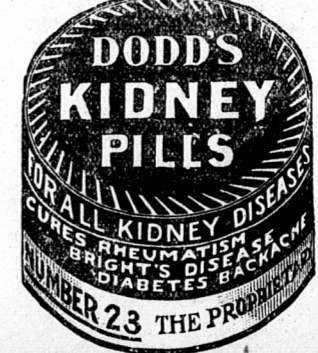
