terians to withhold their budget contributions to the Church until the case of Rev. Perry F. Rockwood had been reviewed.

As chairman of the budget and stewardship committee, Mr. Miller said that he had to resort to long distance telephone and other means to get the committee's approval for a reply that he prepared.

It was recommended, and passed down to Presbyteries for consideration, that public relations responsibility be assigned to two composite committees, one to be known as the "conference secretaries" and the other "on inter-church relations."

Rev. E. J. White of Montreal asked that Presbyteries be given an opportunity to consider this matter of publications circulated by individual ministers in the Church.

Commissioners to the General Assembly have been supplied with a copy of a booklet, "A Divisive Course—What Is It?—What Is It Not?" written by the Rev. Allan S. Reid, whose offices in the Church, Dr. Stuart C. Parker of Toronto said that issue of literature of any kind that proposes to represent the Church is a question for the Church courts and for discipline by those courts.

The author maintains "that any minister who remains loyal to the standards of the Church (the

three articles adopted in 1875) in doctrine, in government and worship, can never be found guilty of following a divisive course in the Church."

He argues that a minister may split his congregation from one end to the other and there may be nothing of a divisive course about it, because his action is not related to the Church standards.

Urge Building Program

Presbyterian commissioners agreed today to have representations made to Federal, Provincial and municipal authorities urging the promotion of a building program, not merely to meet the present housing shortage, but to provide adequate accommodation for newcomers to Canada.

Strong exception to the action was taken by W. H. MacInnes, Vancouver, who termed it "eye-wash" and said Government interference had been a distinct detriment to housing.

The recommendation was passed by a large majority.

In presenting the work of the Board of Missions, Dr. Robert Johnston of Ottawa stated that it spends 70 per cent of the budget receipts of the Church. Increase of stipends for ordained home missionaries and ministers last year cost the board \$125,000.

The board was granted \$25,000 from the advance fund for restoration of building and grounds in Formosa.

Student missionaries in future will receive a minimum of \$10 a Sunday and expenses, it was agreed. Congregations must raise \$1,100 a year to qualify as ordained mission fields. To become an

augmented charge, a congregation must now raise \$1,400 per annum. Catechists (lay preachers) will receive \$1,400 a year plus a house, if married.

LONDON — (CP) — More than 100,000 vehicles have been sold for \$10,000,000 at Ministry of Supply auctions in the last year, and 28 of 34 vehicle dumps have been cleared.
