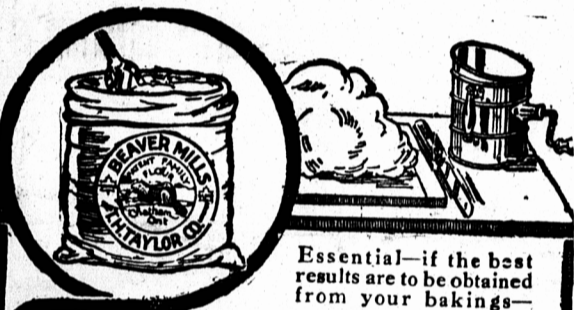

Agricultural High School

Preparations for the opening of the Agricultural High School have begun. Three class rooms have been fitted up and a complete equipment has been provided for the woodworking and farm carpentry department.

A library, reading room and recreation hall will be available and the building is already equipped with electric lighting and steam heating apparatus, hot and cold water, lavatories and shower baths.

The services of competent instructors have been secured and assignments made as follows: 1st Instructor—Animal Husbandry.

2nd Instructor—Field Husbandry and Horticulture. 3rd Instructor—Woodworking, Farm Carpentry and Physical Training.

4th Instructor—Motor Mechanics and Farm Machinery. 5th Instructor—English, Arithmetic, Farm Bookkeeping, Civics and Economics.

In addition, special courses will be given in Dairying, Poultry and lectures in co-operative buying and selling, labor saving devices, road-making, etc.

Should it be found that farm work makes it difficult for students to get in on Nov. 1st, the opening date may be set forward two weeks.

Circular of information, application forms, etc., will be forwarded on application to the Agricultural Department or to the Principal, Agricultural High School, Charlottetown, P. E. Island.
