BEST ON EARTH

WINNIPEG, June 14—The long-expected finding of the royal commission into the operations of the Manitoba government telephone system, made public by Premier Roblin yesterday, proves to be an unmerciful castigation of the administration of the telephone commission, while it expressly absolves the government from responsibility. This is accomplished by quoting the evidence of the commissioners to the effect that they were untrammelled and unhampered in their administration. The report tears to shreds practically every branch of the administration, from construction work to accounting. It concludes by saying that the proposed increases in rates and the introduction of the measured service system are not justified. The measured service system is condemned.

She added that she had long waited to make her own living, but never had a chance to do so in England.

SHOT BY MISTAKE.
NEW YORK, June 15—A shot fired in a gang, mortally wounded an innocent bystander today on East Side. Herman Fisher, a Brooklyn real estate dealer, was standing at the street corner when three men approached. At the same time three other men approached in the opposite direction, and one of them pulled a revolver and fired a shot. Then all the men made off. Fisher was hit in the breast and fell unconscious. Half a dozen policemen ran up but were unable to get any trace of the men. When he revived, Fisher mumbled: "They didn't mean it for me."
