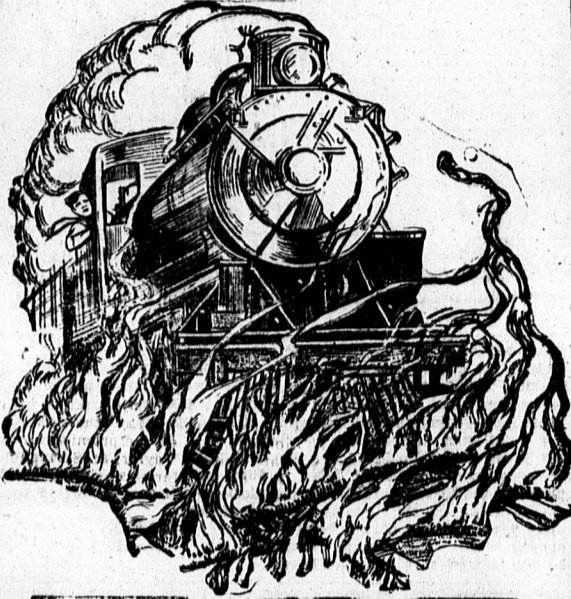

Much Improvement In N. B. Flood Conditions

(Canadian Press.) ST. JOHN, N. B., May 3.—Encouraging reports of flood conditions were given out by C. P. R. officials today when they announced that lines are now open for traffic from St. John to Vancorbo, Fredericton and to St. Stephen, and that their full suburban service had been resumed. Because a section of the Maine-Central between Mattawamkeag and Vancorbo is still under water, the western service is still interrupted.

Locomotive Signal Whistle

Railroading plays an important part in "The Ninety and Nine," which will be shown at the Prince Edward Theatre today and Saturday. LOCOMOTIVE WHISTLE SIGNALS
