Ralston, Minister of Defence, is expected to make a brief speech in connection with the event.

Soviets Capture Dnepropetrovsk

LONDON, Oct. 25—(AP)—Red armies under Gen. Rodion Malinovsky and Gen. Ivan Konev today captured the industrial city of Dnepropetrovsk which the Germans had held for more than two years, thus cleaning out the enemy from the northeastern corner of the Dnieper river loop.

The Canadian (Active) Army, in its 384th overseas casualty list of the war had the following name under the heading, killed in action: Royal Canadian Engineers: Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island Regiment.

OTTAWA, Oct. 26—(CP)—National headquarters estimated tonight that overnight should push subscriptions to Canada's Fifth Victory Loan into the region of the \$1,000,000 mark if the daily average of \$90,000 against a required average of \$85,000 quota within the 15-day campaign.

SAINT JOHN, N.B. Oct. 25—(CP)—New Brunswick's Victory Loan total stood near the \$100,000 mark tonight. Today's subscriptions, \$1,180,400, raised the total to \$3,846,800 but fell below the \$1,500,000 daily average required for the province to reach its \$24,000,000 objective.
