PARIS, Dec. 30.—In addressing the Chamber of Deputies last night Premier Clemenceau made it plain that it was his intention to support Great Britain in the peace negotiations on the question of the freedom of the seas and he declared that his attitude in this matter was approved by President Wilson. The Premier told the Chamber of Deputies that now was not the time to chance pilots but the deputies gave him a vote of confidence which was carried by 300 to 134.
